Day 1

Dr. Anthony J. Onwuegbuzie

Topic: Introduction to qualitative traditions & methods



Anthony J. Onwuegbuzie is Professor in the Department of Educational Leadership at Sam Houston State University (USA), where he teaches doctoral-level courses in qualitative, quantitative, and mixed research. He is also a Distinguished Visiting Professor at the University of Johannesburg. His research areas primarily involve social and behavioral science topics, including disadvantaged and under-served populations such as minorities, children living in war zones, students with special needs, and juvenile delinquents. Additionally, he writes extensively on qualitative, quantitative, and mixed methodologies. With a current h-index of 83, he has secured the publication of more than 400 works, including more than 300 journal articles, 50 book chapters, and 5 books that, collectively, have secured more than 45,000 citations. He has also delivered more than 950 presentations and 200 methodological workshops worldwide and more than 50 keynote addresses across six continents. Currently, he is editor-in-chief of International Journal of Multiple Research Approaches, and a co-editor of Research in the Schools. Also, he is immediate past president of the Mixed Methods Research International Association.

Topic: How to analyze the visual

David Shim is Assistant Professor at the Department of International Relations and International Organization at the University of Groningen (Netherlands). He is interested in the visual and spatial dimension of global politics and works at the intersection of International Relations, Geography and Area Studies. Among others, he has explored comics, film, photography and satellite imagery with regard to their specific politics of representation. His work appeared in International Political Sociology, Geoforum, International Relations of the Asia-Pacific and Review of International Studies. His book Visual Politics and North Korea is available at Routledge. David has translated some of his research activities into teaching practice and can be viewed on his blog 'Visual Global Politics'.

Dr. Anabel Quan-Haase

Topic: How to analyze social media data



Anabel Quan-Haase is Professor of Information and Media Studies and Sociology at the University of Western Ontario. She engages in interdisciplinarity, knowledge transfer, and public outreach. Her focus is on social change, social media, and social networks. Through her policy work she has cooperated with the Benton Foundation, Partnership for Progress on the Digital Divide, Federal Communications Commission (FCC), and Canada's Digital Policy Forum. She is the co-editor of the Handbook of Social Media Research Methods with Luke Sloan (Sage, 2017) and the co-author of Real-life Sociology with Lorne Tepperman (Oxford University Press, 2018) as well as the author of Technology and Society (Oxford University Press, 2016). She is the author of over 50 articles, proceedings, and book chapters and has presented over 100 papers at conferences. Her work has appeared in top journals of the field including New Media & Society, Journal of Computer-Mediated Communication, Information, Communication & Society, Journal of the Association for Information Science and Technology (JASIST), The Information Society, Journal of Documentation, Information Research, Big Data + Society, and Journal of Social and Personal Relationships.
